Hello Big Easy Wing

I am pulling the Safety Column duty this month, so bear with me. Are you working in the yard this month? It is that time of year. In the oil field, we always did a safety analysis before starting any job. We wanted to ask ourselves: “what if?”

Are your tools in serviceable condition? Check your extension cords for bare spots and worn insulation. Repair as required-replace as needed. Put a good edge on that knife or clipper. A dull tool will hurt you faster than a sharp one. Wait...what? If you must exert more effort than normal to make the cut, the tool could slip and bite you. And please cut away from your body. Always cut away.

If you get tired, take a break. Like heat exhaustion and heat stroke, fatigue will also cloud your thinking and make dangerous decisions. Hydrate. Rest. Think before you act.

Inspect your ladder before each use. Are the feet in good condition? Are the rungs solid? Look at those side rails. Are they worn, cracked, or bent? Ditch it. Never paint a wooden ladder. It hides defects from inspection. The same inspection criteria apply to metal ladders. Extension ladders should be set at a 4 to 1 ratio. Move the base out from the wall one foot for every four feet of height from the ground to where it touches the wall. Secure it from moving or have someone steady it. And always watch out for low electric lines.

Injuries can also result from other activities. In fact, the majority occur during what we call “routine work.” Humans tend to show higher situational awareness if the job is new or has obvious dangers. The reverse is also true. If there are no obvious dangers, we can fall victim to complacency. Keep your head on a swivel. Maintain that high degree of situational awareness and always ask “what if?”

Going up and down stairs is most certainly a routine activity. Some of us go slower than we used to, but to avoid problems, three points of contact are mandatory. Two feet on the steps and one hand on the handrail. If it requires two hands to carry the load, get help, get a hand truck, or devise a safer plan.

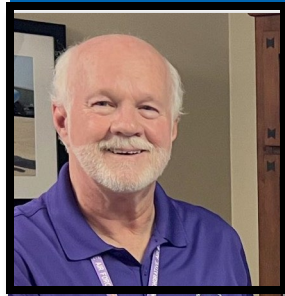
Hello CAF,
