#### **Don Clausing, Safety Officer**

As mentioned in the article by Jim Helms, the fun is about to begin. Aircrafts will be in our hangar! As Safety Officer, I will be working with Jim Helms on several presentations. With the arrival of the Stearman, marshalling becomes paramount to the safety and movement of the aircraft. Once again, you are asked to review the <u>CAF marshalling</u> video and the <u>Marshalling guide</u>. In weeks to come, we will be addressing: First responders, movement of equipment and supplies, review movement and nonmovement areas. and our Evacuation Plan.

Just to keep you up to date, the First Aid Kits have been installed in the Hangar. We have one large CO2 fire extinguisher and we are working on obtaining a roll out fire extinguisher unit.. Just a review—**Fires:** Class A: Fires involving ordinary combustible materials, such as wood, cloth, paper, rubber and plastic. Class B: Fires involving flammable liquids, oils, greases, oil base paints, lacquers, solvents, alcohols and flammable gases. Class C: Fires involving energized electrical equipment where the use of an extinguishing media that is electrically nonconductive is important. **Fire Extinguishers:** Water: Class A type fires are best controlled with water by cooling the material below its ignition temperature and soaking the material to prevent re-ignition. **Carbon Dioxide Extinguisher:** Class B and C fires are best controlled by carbon dioxide as a blanketing agent



But for now, my first tip on Safety is Personal Safety: 1.Eye Protection: Safety Glasses, Goggles or Face Shields for various types of physical or chemical eye exposures. 2. Hearing Protection: Ear Plugs or Ear Muffs for noise exposure. 3. Respiratory Protection: Dust Masks, Chemical or Air Supplied Respirators as appropriate for particulate or chemical exposure. 4. Hand

Protection: Work or Chemical Gloves. 5. Head Protection: Hard Hats if there is an overhead hazard. We want to promote a culture of Safety!

## **Event Volunteers Needed**

We are participating in the 2018 World War II Air, Sea, and Land Festival for 2018 and need committed volunteers to help with set up and take down with our booth areas as well as help manning our booth on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Putting on an event takes a big commitment and couldn't happen without volunteers! Join us if you are interested!

We will have a sign up sheet at this meeting and at the September meeting. We will probably have 3 different areas that will need support volunteers. The shifts, depending on the numbers of participants, will be three to four hours.

At our September meeting, we will also have a sign up sheet for members to volunteer for the Hammond Air Show which is October 20th.
