

The Commemorative Air Force is impressive. It has an impressive number of airplanes. It has an impressive number of chapters / wings. And most importantly, it has the most impressive number (and dare I say *QUALITY*) of committed volunteers!

One of the not so fun things of any organization is managing all these assets. And with the number the CAF has, to call it difficult would be an understatement. Fortunately, our own Big Easy Wing is keeping that simple, since we only have to go to one place check on everything... *cafbew.kastrack.com*.

So as near the end of the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter, let's look at our stats, current as of May 24<sup>th</sup>, 2019:

We have 108 members and 2 cadets!

38% of our members have signed the 'Hold Harmless.' Thank you to the 41 people that have done so.

58% of our members have paid their dues. Thank you, that keeps us flying! 44% of our members have paid their National CAF HQ dues. NOTE: This number may be skewed by HQ's current tracking system, which doesn't always identify when someone is a member of the Big Easy Wing.

Let's focus on the Hold Harmless this month. It is the easiest (And cheapest!!) one to get compliant.
