Operation Officer's Report - JD Olson

With the recent reconditioning of the Wing's PT-17 Stearman, we're just a step away from flying it on a regular basis. That brings a few things to mind as we prepare to do so. First, we face the challenge of Lakefront Airport closing its main runway, 18R/36L, for an extended period starting late this month. With the "long" (6,867' x 150') runway closed, we will have to use the shorter and narrower (3,967' x 75') parallel runway, 18R/36L. A challenge, indeed. Quite obviously, we will need to do most of our training, including touch-and-go and full stop landing practice, at other airfields in the GNO area.

Second, I will be putting out a notice soon for those who have signed up for our PT-17 Aircraft Sponsorship that will spell out the requirements needed to begin training in the Stearman. In addition to prior-to-flight qualifications, it will address priority for the start of training with the biggest drivers being who can be checked out the soonest, based on prior "tailwheel" aircraft experience, as well as availability to fly, in order to get them certified for the public "Rides" program in which the PT can begin generating revenue to offset its cost of operation. More to follow on that as soon as the draft has been run past our Unit Leader and our Chief Pilot for their input and concurrence as fellow members of BEW's Flight Evaluation Board (FEB).

Last, the Aircraft Sponsors are advised to make sure all your qualifications, and past and current flight experience have been updated in Kastrack because in order to begin training in the Stearman, all elements of your cockpit experience will be reviewed by CAF HQ upon receipt of the Transition Letters we will be submitting soon on each pilot. Bottom line: It's best to get your ducks in line (as the saying goes) as soon as possible.

Safety Officer's Report - Don Clausing



Hurricane season is upon us. Last year, we started on our plan for hurricane preparedness. We developed an outline of task and ask for members to join our Hurricane Hangar Group. As you can recall from last year, we had 2 threats that required action on our part. In Sep-

tember, due to T.S. Gordon our aircraft had to be flown to Hammond. In October, Hurricane Micheal which tracked northeast of us and slammed into Mexico Beach Florida caused water to rise all the way to our hangar door for 2 days.



Here is what was devised in 2018. We still need to further develop this Hurricane preparedness procedure:

1) Awareness (60 hours)

To send an email to all members indicating that a potential threat is eminent. By communication officer (please be sure to log into KAStract to ensure your email and cell phone is up to date)

To contact Airport Director to receive their directives (50 miles hour winds the airport stops flights). By Unit Leader

To contact identified Pilots (approved PT 17 and Stuka) and receiving airports/hangar (Hammond Gray Aviation). By Operation Officer, Pilot Officer and Paul Cutrer of Gray Aviation

2) Standby (48-60 hours)

To prepare BEW hangar by raising items (tools/furniture) to office area and by removing pertinent supplies and paperwork. By BEW volunteers

To contact an identified person of the potential need of the golf cart removal. By Unit Leader

To fly aircrafts to Hammond/Gray Aviation. By designated/available Pilot

3) Response (0-48 hours)


To remove golf cart (by trailer or driven to a more secure hangar at KNEW), By designated person

To do a final check and secure hangar (electrical panal/box turned off, doors secure and tied down, all signage removed) By Safety Officer/Maintenance Officer

Items to update: List of approved pilots given to operation officer, update member phone and email list, complete an inventory of hangar items.

Korrecting the Konfusion!

There has been a lot of confusion on how to find and login to KAStrack. My article this month will focus on clearing up some of this confusion.

It's all in the Definition...

REGISTERING YOUR ACCOUNT

Typically, before you can use a member website, you have to register for it first, inputting your email, username, phone, etc. This is similar to registering for an account at your bank, Amazon, or eBay to buy all those WWII artifacts. Upon successful registration, you will have created a **User Profile** which typically includes your username, personal details, and password.

1st layer of confusion... when we first setup KAStrack, we took the existing CAF member list and directly inputted it. This registered and created user profiles for existing members. This means members that joined the Big Easy Wing after March 2019 will need to REGISTER for an account with KAStrack.

For those VERY FEW that need to register, the easiest way is to go to our public page https://bigeasywing.org/about/application/, scroll down to the end, and click on the "New Member" link.

LOGGING IN TO YOUR ACCOUNT

For 99% of us, this is where we start. First, choose your weapon! I suggest using the Edge, Chrome, or Firefox Browser. Internet Explorer users will find many websites do not render correctly, KAStrack included. Our KAStrack website is located at http://cafbew.kastrack.com.

 2^{nd} layer of confusion... if you have applied for a lakefront access card, they also use KAStrack. Their login information is separate from ours and it is like going to Galveston for Mardi Gras... Do not be confused: it's not the same! Just use the url listed above, and everything will be okay.

Your Username.

Remember how we mentioned that we created user profiles for many of our members? Unless you created it, your username is your first name followed by a period and your last name. So Buck Rogers becomes "buck.rogers" and that is what is entered in the user name field.

Your Password.

If you never knew your password, or you forgot it, just click the "Forgot Password" link underneath the password field. This will prompt you to enter your username or email, and it will email you a link to change your password. If you don't receive an email, your email address was either not entered into the system correctly, possibly due to your hieroglyphics (See 3rd layer of confusion) being misinterpreted. If you do not received a password reset email, please ask Shirley or me to check on that for you. Please do not 'REGISTER' again, as you will then be prompted twice for dues from the system!

<u>3rd layer of confusion...</u> Remember how we mentioned that we created user profiles for many of our members? We did so by using the Big Easy Wing registration forms you filled out by hand. And let me be the first to tell ya... ain't nobody in our group winning any awards for penmanship!

I hope this article clears up some of the confusion. We have a wealth of information on this site for our members, so please log in and get familiar!
