When I travel outside NOLA to attend a CAF related function, I am so impressed with the progress our young unit has made in so little time. For example, recently I was complaining that we have been without a flying plane in the rides program for over two years when I was told there are some units that haven't gotten a plane in the air for almost 22 years! Yikes! Sometimes we can be hard on ourselves when in truth we have so much to be grateful for. I am grateful for you all as my fellow wing mates. I need to say that more often. Operation Officer's Report - JD Olson

As we continue to enjoy, speaking for myself, this cool and brisk winter weather, we aren't exactly sitting by the fire whiling away the hours here in the Big Easy Wing. Planning for the upcoming warmer and more predictable skies of spring means that we're busy with things associated with getting our Stearman PT-17 Kaydet (aka "New Orleans Lady") ready to begin flying in earnest. We've been jumping through various hoops to do so, as follows: 1. The aircraft, with its new engine and propeller, came through its annual inspection (AI) with "flying colors" meaning all things that needed work were done on time and within budget thanks to great work done by our IA Jim Shaw and subsequently very well maintained by our "MX" Terry Clausing. 2. All necessary paperwork - the plane's registration certificate, AI checklist, etc. - have been submitted to the designated CAF official who is now working with the FAA to obtain the necessary Letter of Authorization (LOA) we need to be able to carry paying passengers in our upcoming Rides program. 3. Along with that, our Safety Officer Dave 'Cando' Cantin has begun putting in place our CAF and FAA approved Drug & Alcohol monitoring program that also plays into the sought-after LOA to allow us into the CAF Rides arena. He will be ably assisted in that effort by Donald Allen. 4. The plane will soon undergo installment of the ADS-B (Automatic Dependent Surveillance - Broadcast) unit required by the FAA to enable it to be tracked by Air Traffic Control. Following that, the radio and cockpit seat harnesses will be replaced...all of which are needed for safety of flight whether carrying paying passengers or training new pilots.

Speaking of pilots, we soon will have a third Stearman pilot in the BEW Ready Room - the one and only 'Evil' (callsign) Ben Cook, our resident F-15 pilot on active duty with the Louisiana Air National Guard and Deputy Commander of the 159th Tactical Fighter Wing at NAS/JRB New Orleans in Belle Chasse. He is current in the T-6 Texan, another tailwheel trainer used by the military during WWII, which gives him a very good background leading into learning to fly the PT and will be training, after completing the required Stearman ground school, under our Chief Pilot Jim 'Batman' Helms. When fully trained and checked out, Ben will join Batman and our IA Jim Shaw as a threesome of qualified pilots providing safe-yet-thrilling rides to the public both locally out of Lakefront Airport as well as on the road to such places as Opelousas in June. That concludes this report and, as always....

Fly (and drive) safe.

Safety Officer's Report-Dave Cantin



When you think about safety people normally think about preventing something bad from happening. Preventing a cut, fall, burn, breaking something valuable, etc. But we should also include preventing someone from dying who didn't have an accident or did but now need assistance. What I'm talk-

ing about is knowing First Aid, CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) and how to use an AED (Automated External Defibrillator). If you're working in the hanger and someone falls unconscious near you, or you see someone unconscious on the floor do you know what to do? What if they're working on a plane and they cut themselves badly?

We began talking about this in the Marshalling Detachment late last year and it dawned on me that we're an ideal environment for needing people trained for all three – First Aid, CPR and AED. Our CAF wings and the airshows have a high concentration of middle to later aged individuals, so this is important. To kick this off I need to lead by example, so I took the Red Cross class that combines all three. It was given at their office on Canal St, lasted from 9-3 and cost \$97, and it was great. I had taken it twice before many years ago (need to renew it every two years) and was surprised at how much the technology and practices have changed. They offer the class several times a week so scheduling it isn't a problem.

There's a new <u>KASTrack</u> certification for this so when you get your certification upload it.



Red Cross has a great First Aid phone app that shows you what to do in different situations. Download it and check it out. I also put several CPR Face Shields (mouth barriers) in the first aid kit.

So, this is a call for volunteers. We need several members to do this for both your personal benefit and for the wing and airshow safety. I personally need others to do it too, as I can't perform CPR on myself! https://www.redcross.org/local/louisiana/take-a-class/cpr-new-orleans-la

FYI, the BEW didn't spring for a \$1,500 AED but I did talk to the fire department across the ramp from the hanger and they said we can use their AED anytime. If you have any question please contact Dave Cantin at caf@cantin.org or 504-616-3604.



Ground School Report - Dave Cantin

Every year most CAF wings with active aircraft conduct a "Ground School" which covers everything from flight crew member responsibilities to how to sell and document rides for hire to running a PX. The CAF Gulf Coast Wing (B-17 Texas Raiders) graciously invited four members from the Big Easy Wing to attend their ground school, so combined with a couple of us who are also members of the GCW the BEW had a nice showing at their Feb 1 class. This includes Donald Allen, Richard and Austin Wood, Wayne Breaux, Robert Claypool, Dave Capo and me, and it also included attending their Awards dinner the night before.



Our goal was to gather information from a wing that does this very well and we weren't disappointed. The first half of the day was general information about membership recruiting, safety, cadet programs, mar-

Drug and Alcohol Supervisor's Report - Dave Cantin



With our Stearman closing in on being qualified to take passengers for rides the remaining hurdle is implementing the FAA mandated drug program that is stipulated in the FAA Letter or Authorization (LOA) for carrying passengers for hire. I accepted the role of Drug and Alcohol Supervisor and have been working on the training and preparation needed to perform this correctly. This is an FAA/DOT drug program that mainly affects our pilots and maintenance area. Any qualified pilot can fly our Stearman but only a qualified pilot enrolled in the drug program can fly with a passenger for hire. On the maintenance side, outside of washing the Stearman and perhaps washing parts, only someone enrolled in the drug program can work on her. Also anyone we contract to

work on the Stearman in any capacity must be on the FAA/DOT drug program. Operations and Maintenance will need to take that into consideration when sourcing outside work.

How does the program work? Well, we have two qualified pilots at the moment and an A&P that need to enroll in the program. That involves some paperwork and taking a "Pre-employment" drug test. Thereafter there's random testing for both drugs and alcohol. These should not happen often as the chances of being tested are 25%/year for drugs and 10%/year for alcohol. The test clinics are at 4100 Canal St in New Orleans or 1900 S Morrison Blvd in Hammond.

There will be three of us trained to process new hires and random tests. In addition to myself we're going to name a second supervisor and Dave Capo as Wing Leader is the third. The drug program becomes effective for flying and working on the Stearman on the day she is added to the LOA, which could be any time. I am rolling this out in advance so that there is no lag in our ability to fly and work on the Stearman when that happens.

The FAA takes this program very seriously and can do unannounced hanger inspections. The consequences are serious and expensive for the BEW for not administering it correctly, and for the members in the program for not follow the testing rules correctly and passing the tests. The BEW wants to thank all of our donors. We appreciate all of our donors generosity especially the Carrollton Rotary Club (\$5000), Ameri-

can Legion Post 307 (\$1000) and Mitch Sammons (\$1000). Be assured that your money will be put toward aircraft restoration. As Colonel Olson mentioned in his article, the Stearman is scheduled for the ADS-B installation mid-February. The monies raised (\$6704) will off-set the cost of this repair as well as seat belts. If any BEW member donated over \$40.00 to the Stearman and would like their BEW patch, please see me at this meeting. All of our out of town donors will receive their patch through the mail.

Although CAF is no longer promoting the 12 Planes of Christmas, the site is still open for donations. You may make a donation at that site, mail a donation to the BEW or <u>donate online</u>, the BEW will forward the monies to the CAF. Just designate your donation for either the Stearman or the Stuka.

To our surprise, BEW was approved by the AAHFM (American Airpower Heritage Flying Museum) board for \$7500.00 matching grant money for the Stuka. Presently, the Stuka has raised \$5525 so far. If you were thinking about donating this would be the time to do it. If we can raise \$7500 and AAHFM will match it with another \$7500 it will give our wing, \$15,000 to spend on the Stuka. Both planes were submitted to the AAHFM grant restoration fund but only the Stuka received the matching funds.

As you know fundraising never ends. We, like millions of other non-profit organizations, cannot survive without donations. So please help us by promoting the Big Easy Wing. At many outings, Don and I regularly weave the CAF/BEW into our conversations resulting either in donations, membership or interest. If anyone needs BEW business cards, please see me at the next meeting. You never know when you may meet someone that would be interested in joining, donating or participating in an event. Thanks for all that you do for the BEW. When you are invested in your organizations greats things happen. Get ready to see our New Orleans Lady soaring over New Orleans in the next few months.


