



Operation Officer's Report - JD Olson

As the weather gods continue to battle over the Pelican State's landscape with the climate vacillating between the extremes of cool and chilly to warm and steamy, we find ourselves wondering just when the air will be stable enough to get our PT-17 New Orleans Lady flying on a regular basis. With it now in the very capable hands of Sonny Schilleci's Auric Avionics across the airport, we anticipate getting it back soon with an ADS-B installed and its antique VHF radio and cockpit seat harnesses replaced with state-of-the-art equipment. In short, it will be a "full up round" in military parlance.

While the airplane is going through those modifications, our request for a Letter of Authorization is being scrutinized by the Flight Standards District Office in Atlanta. We have a friend in CAF's Bob Heath working with the FSDO to try to expedite the LOA process and we greatly appreciate his efforts in doing so.

The same Bob Heath paid us a visit a few weeks ago on behalf of CAF Operations to look over our Langhurst Stuka to determine its airworthiness and he seemed very impressed with what he saw both in the



plane itself and in its ever-important documentation. Our trusty MX, Terry Clausing, had everything perfectly in order...as he always does. We now await a final decision from CAF HQ as to when we'll be granted authorization for a test hop to be flown by our Chief Pilot, Jim 'Batman' Helms who is anxious to get it into the air.



The Stearman is being outfitted with its new ADS-B Out transponder and a new radio, just in time for the rides season. Speaking of rides, the Stearman is in the final approval process for the LOA (Letter of Authorization) allowing the Wing to fly the plane for the LHFE (Living History Flight Experience) for the first time. Thanks to all who made that happen. As for the Stuka, a big announcement about that plane will be made at our next meeting. Both of these topics were discussed in detail in private meetings with the HQ officers in charge. I am grateful for their time and amazing experience.

Safety Officer's Report-Dave Cantin



What a great event Wing Staff Conference was; if you go to one of these once you'll be hooked. I was and I enjoyed my second one even more. Lots of opportunities to meet people and see how other wings are doing things. Safety had a good role in the presentations which I expected and enjoyed learning new things.

For this article I want to focus on two things. The upcoming events we're involved in and safety by following procedures. Our upcoming events are the Open House on April 4 and participation in the St Landry/Opelousas War-bird Expo. With that you will be hearing calls for volunteers and my calls for helping everyone be safe.

In both events we will have lots of people milling around looking at everything interesting and not what could get them in trouble, so we need lots of BEW volunteers just keeping an eye on them. They'll be crossing the ramp from the fence to the hanger, we'll have aircraft around there and in the hanger, aircraft arriving and leaving and just a lot of moving parts. If you haven't volunteered for anything else, please help us help them have a good and safe time.

With a little luck we'll have the Stearman flying around during the Open House. If it does, we will push it away from the event and can use help escorting riders to and from the aircraft. From a safety side, the obvious item is stay 100'+ away from a running aircraft. The less obvious is watch out for prop wash. That's another reason for pushing it away from the crowd.

I'm hoping we can keep the fence gate open and use a rope line from the fence to the hanger on both sides. The Fire Dept has to approve that and if they do we'll still need people guarding the rope line. Maybe the same volunteers helping keep an eye on everyone in and around the hanger?

Safety by following procedures is somewhat a repeat of my first newsletter article but with an update. I'm a firm believer in following the instructions that have been proven to work and work safely and to expand on what the CAF offers in regulations, I created a BEW Safety Manual geared to what we do. The Gulf Coast Wing has a great operations manual and I started with their safety section and modified it to meet our needs. It's in KASTrack in the BEW General Section listed as BEW Safety Manual. PLEASE take a few minutes and read it, or at least the parts that you think might impact you.

CAF HQ has also updated their CAFR60-1 Operations Regulation and the CAFR66-1 Maintenance Policies and Procedures. These are on KASTrack under CAF General and for those in Operations and Maintenance they are not optional reading. Please be familiar with them. Also, it's required to keep a hard copy of the CAFR 66.1 in the hanger.


