

Ben "Evil" Cook led the pilot instruction starting off with a "Day in the life of a CAF pilot" which covered what gear pilots are expected to wear, administration duties prior to flying, passenger briefing items, flight profiles, local area procedures, camera usage and cross-country operations and planning. The second brief was all about

The New Orleans Lady - N1617M - our beautiful Stearman. The Stearman ground school consisted of all the standard weight and balance, performance, and flight envelope information, preflight/walk around, refueling, entry/exit, taxi and postflight events. After the slideshow, we braved the cold of the hangar to do an in-person walk around, preflight then a demo of refueling operations climbing up on the nose to get to the fuel tank. Several side discussions covered some of the topics Ben sent out via email prior to the training day including the tailwheel school presentation produced by CAF HQ. We have a lot of potential new tail-wheel pilots!

After some discussion about who wanted to brave the cold, Jared Spencer (a new prospective Stearman pilot) joined Evil for an intro flight in the Stearman. Thankfully, the day had warmed up considerably and it turned out to be an excellent opportunity to aviate! The first ride prompted a couple of other BEW members to opt for a ride in the
