




Greetings and Happy New Year!

I hope you all have had a wonderful holiday period over the past two months with family and friends. I have stayed incredibly busy with flying in the Guard and assisting Santa with delivering presents into Christmas, but I was fortunately able to spend some time with family and friends in Virginia over the holidays.

Over the past few months, we have been able to take advantage of a few periods of pleasant weather to run the engine on the *N'Awlins Lady* and to get it up in the air. At

the end of December, we had trouble starting the engine after it had been sitting for several weeks, with a suspect primer being a culprit. Terry Clausing devoted a lot of time and hard work to get her running smoothly again- replacing two Orings on the primer, putting in a new air filter, checking the spark plug gaps and wear, and a few other things. We also got a much-needed new tailwheel which Terry installed as well. The previous one had chunks out of the side and worn down over an inch in diameter over the years!

Today I was able to take a new Stearman sponsor and prospective pilot, Jared Spencer, up to fly. Jared joined the CAF and the squadron and voiced his interest



to fly, bringing a decent amount of tail wheel experience to the table and a strong desire to get involved. I later found out that he was a year ahead of me at the Naval Academy and that we were on the Offshore Sailing Team together there! Safety Officer —Richard Wood



I wish everyone a prosperous year. I would like to thank the membership for their show of support for me as their new Safety Officer. Here is a little bit about my background. I spent 27 years in the Air Force reserves in the 403rd wing. The home of the famous hurricane hunters. I worked on the C130 H and J models. Presently, I am the Fire Chief of the Addis Fire Department. Both of these career paths provide me with knowledge that lends itself to aircraft and fire safety. I am pleased to be your new Safety Of-

ficer

I would like to remind everyone of some of the things we need to keep in mind for when we sell rides at air shows. When the aircraft is starting the prop area is very dangerous. We need to make sure the prop arc is clear. The area behind the aircraft is hazardous due to two things:1. prop blast and 2. small flying objects. This is especially true for your bigger aircraft. Always, remember to distance yourself from the aircraft when it is moving. The aircraft wing can be deceiving.

Something to think about with cold weather arriving: Gas heaters need to be checked for cracks to prevent from carbon monoxide poisoning and filters need changing to maintain proper air flow. The biggest problem I have at this time of year is with the space heaters. People tend to place them to close to furniture. And NEVER use an extension cord for them. Let's all be safe.

It is difficult just to talk about the PX because Rides, Donations, and Membership are all part of the Square reporting system. Like all software programs updates occur. In March the Square allowed us to input CASH sales so that gave the PX a better way of reporting. Reports are given to the board quarterly. Reports include all categories stated above. It is nice that the wing has the capability to charge but at the same time, as you all know, there is a cost for that convenience. The Square charges 2.76 percent.
