- Improvement: Remove electives (See Observation 2)

**Observation:** Loadmaster and Maintenance should not occur at the same time / Marshalling and Loadmaster should not occur at the same time

• **Improvement:** Different electives are not needed until we grow a little larger. Add ~1 hour to the event and have everyone exposed to all the classes.

**Observation:** When trying to introduce our guest speak, Colonel USMC (*Ret*) Bob Jablonksi, **I was befuddled because Bob's bio sheet was so remarkable.** 

• Improvement: Pick speakers that have no accomplishments.

leagues and friends. Together, let's inspire people to give generously so that we can make our wing stronger.




