# Safety Officer —Richard Wood



Good day everyone!



It is that time of year-Hurricane season. Here are a few reminders of what to do: Generators: when hooking it up remember to turn off the main breaker to the house so that you don't back feed to the pole. It could cause injuries to the lineman restoring the power

Gas:  $\Box$  top the tank off in all your vehicles. Gas cans should be filled a few days before the hurricane hits. I fill them up when the hurricane enters the Gulf. Each person should know the amount of gas his Generators use.

Food: electric stove don't work without power. I suggest a propane stove are even a gas grill. Things that need to be kept cold should be used as soon as possible. Your freezer will keep things cold a few days without opening it. Stock up on cans goods.

#### Evacuation routes:

You should know your area and which roads flood in a heavy rain. Some roads floods early due to tidal surge, which can happen hours before the hurricane makes land fall. If you can move vehicles to a high point-plan to do so early.

#### Contact numbers:

Plan to have a few people that you can get in touch within case of emergency. Remember land lines and cell phones might not work. Texting is better. Be sure to carry your charge cord.

With proper planning we can make the best things happen when a hurricane occurs

Note—Hurricane alert may require us to implement our Hurricane preparation procedures. This requires our leaders to call on members to help out with the hangar pick-up and removal of items. Our hangar is at the lowest point of the airport. Depending on the storm most items can be lifted and the plane moved to another hangar further up. This always needs to be done prior to the flood gates closing. However, depending on the category and the direction, the plane may need to be flown out of the city. Mike Scott is looking into possibilities.






## **Educational Activities**
