Greetings Big Easy Wing!




squadron operations, Linda who had previously purchased a ride, and new aircraft sponsor and potential new pilot Scottie Burge.

Good day everyone!

Summer is almost over, and kids are getting ready for school. But we cannot forget about the heat, humidity, and school zones. Please drink plenty of liquids, protect yourself from the sun and watch for those kids.

Now, let us prepare for winter. Those of you who have fireplaces need to make sure the chimney is clean and there are no cracks in the bricks. Chimney fires are nothing to play with and can start a fire in the attic. Fighting a fire in a chimney is very difficult. The cracks in the bricks (if there are any) can increase the likelihood of the fire getting into the Attic. This makes getting access to the fire more troublesome for firefighters.

Another thing is to remember that smoke detectors batteries need to be replaced. First Alert detector requires a 9-volt battery, which should be tested, and battery replaced 2 times a year. Kidder mod # 19010 has a sealed battery that last 10 years. It is the one that our fire department is installing for qualifying households. Houses that have a gas furnace and stove should have a CO2 detector - one in the kitchen and the other by the furnace
