Hello Everyone



I hope everyone has recovered from the very successful flight day on the 25th of March.

Spring is here and summer is right around the corner. We are already setting high temperatures for April. As we get ready for a busy flying and static display season, here are a few things to remember:

--Being on the flight line heat from the sun and the concrete hits you quicker than you think so hydration is very important. Thus, it is important to drink at least 3 bottles of water then 1 Gatorade to replace your electrolytes. Water alone does not do that. NOTE: drinking just Gatorade is not good.

Sunscreen is important. Sunshine and reflected sun can get you. Also, wearing a hat helps but it does not protect your neck and arms so remember to put sunscreen all over.
