Greetings:

Now that Mardi Gras is over, we can get back to being a flying Wing. However, there are still parades getting ready to roll in the coming weeks.

On March 15 we will be holding our annual Ground School. We will have a guest speaker, Jerry Strahan, who is the author of Andrew Higgins' biography. It should be very educational and informative.

I just returned from attending the CAF Winter Conference in Dallas. As you know, this May will be the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Victory in Europe (VE) Day. During the Second World War, Britain-shipped tens of thousands of recruits to the U.S. for training. Once pilot, seaman, or artilleryman training was completed, they returned to Britain, all except for 431.

These 431 never made it back to their homeland. They perished in training accidents, civilian accidents, or due to illness and were interred in cemeteries dotting the country to this day.

The Commemorative Air Force, in honor of the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Victory in Europe is leading a symbolic effort to bring these boys back home and reunite these young men with their families. The CAF will have volunteers across the country visiting all 431 graves to carefully make gravestone rubbing for each. These will be transported back to the UK on the "Ready for Duty", a CAF aircraft traveling from Texas to the UK this spring.

In speaking with the project leader, I found out that 6 of these graves are in our area. One is in the Greenwood Cemetery, and 3 are in the Chalmette Battlefield cemetery. I will get the locations of the remaining graves soon. Once this information is received and we receive the materials for the rubbings, a notice will go out to the members to assist in this worthwhile project.



Other events are in the planning stage and will be reported to the members when finalized. Presently we are working on another FAA workshop with Cedric Grimes. He did a fantastic presentation last year. We are looking at Saturday April 5 for a fly-in and a FAA workshop. Stay tune for updates. Please check the event page

#### Unit Leader article continues


Our last meeting was held at the site PT boat 305 at the National WW2 Museum. We had a good turnout and everyone was impressed with its history and all the repairs.

Greetings!

We held our first Kaydet Training Program of 2025, teaching the Boy Scout Aviation Merit Badge course on Saturday, March 8<sup>th</sup>. In attendance were scouts from Troop 796. As in the past, this course provides training for the Scouts to be eligible for the Aviation Merit Badge. It follows the Aviation Merit

Badge requirements as outlined by the Scouting organization.

Six students engaged in learning activities that covered types of aircraft, forces acting on aircraft, what makes a wing fly and they had hands-on experience with our flight simulators, where they actually flew a course, they plotted during the navigation module training.

On March 22<sup>nd</sup> students from Troop 223, which is also Kevin Duxworth's son's Troop, will attend the course. On April 19th we have scouts from Troop 45 attending, and I will also be coordinating with Susan Boudreaux, who's Troop 18 attended our training on July 20, 2024, for another six students.

All members of Big Easy Wing who completed the requirements to be a Boy Scout Merit Badge Counselor, should have gotten an email reminder to renew their certification. If you haven't received that, or if you need assistance completing the renewal, please contact me, as I will be glad to assist you.

I am looking forward to a busy and productive year, as we will find out in late March how much we have been rewarded from the Galatoire Foundation Grant. The Board of Directors will discuss how we will spend the money and I anticipate an allotment for upgrading the Flight Simulators along with installing better Wifi for Internet access. #### Pilot / Plane Session (Led by Kris Caldwell)

#### Intro to PX (Led by Shirley Colomb):

Come learn what the sound of sales is all about. Our PX tent is one of the primary ways we raise funds for our wing. And one of the best perks, when you work the PX tent, you get a space in the shade at Air Shows!

#### **Education (Led by Roger Jeffrey):**

Education is one of the core missions of the Commemorative Air Force. Participants will get to review the existing training programs, as always help brainstorm new ideas. The Big Easy Wing now boasts flight simulators, which makes it more fun to reach kids and adults alike! #### Marshalling (Led by Richard Gray):
