It's been great to be back in the US after a four-month military stint overseas. Last month we had another

wonderful ground school- many thanks to all who participated. My special thanks goes to Kris and Terry for all of the hard work keeping the Stearman running and flying rides while I was gone, outstanding work!





Kris and I had a good recurrent flight, and we are working to try to make him an instructor so that he can also train new Stearman pilots. As things warm up here and the music festivals start, we are also looking forward to flying ride events and potentially local fly ins in coming months

I recently got back from two weeks of traveling the southeast in my Lancair, from New Orleans to Memphis to Manassas just outside of DC, then down to Florida and back to Memphis. I found a few Stearman's in museums in VA and FL during this trip. The N2S-5 in the Udvar-Hazy Air & Space Museum at Dulles flew at the same base and during the same period (1943) as the "N'awlins Lady"- World War II in Ottumwa, Iowa! Perhaps young Student

Hello Big Easy Wing!



Good Afternoon BEW

A quick note to let everyone know that we are fixing to get into our busy season. Let get the word out when we are having a flight day. Fights are a primary source of income.

That being said a few things to remember.

Loading and unloading the aircraft, we need to make sure that customers and kids stay on the black section of the plane. Remind everyone not to touch the windshield.

After landing make sure the prop has stopped and the chocks mags are turned off.

When the plane is on display and kids are taking pictures remember the black stripes on the wing. In addition, setting up the chain around the plane leave room between the chain and the plane so kids will not have the urge to touch the wing.
